

4. For a simple set up, use a piece of foam rubber or terry toweling to stop your cars at the end of the straightaway; or...



... Take another piece of 15" straight track; mark straight line with white pencil along top side, using




8. Assemble single lanes to each arm of a piece of "Y" track (No. 2503 - \$1.75 a pair). Fasten joints with No. 1588 Track Repair Clips, using Qui-




kee-Lok to push them into place at center of lane. 9. Assemble Aurora Double Station Pit Stop (No.



1453 · \$2.00) according to instructions; place pieces of foam rubber inside, as shown.





10. Connect "Y" and single-lane track unit to end of straightaway, with single lanes running into bay

straight track, attaching AFX Safety Wall-Pak with Clip-On-Anywhere terminal and AFX Dragster Xmas Tree at one end. Attach Speed Controls to Clip-On Terminal. Set up Automatic Finish Line Indicator at other end.

GET SET - for greater realism, a perfect 1/4 mile can be set up just as easily. A scale 1/4 mile is approximately 15 feet 2 1/8 inch or 182 1/8 inch. Using 15" straight track (No. 2542 - \$1.25 ea.), you'll need 13 pieces. Set up your Xmas Tree 6 7/6" from the end of the first straight piece; and place the Finish Line Marker 6" from the end of the last piece. Or use 21 pieces of 9" straight (No. 2517 - 75¢ ea.), placing Xmas Tree 6" from one end and Finish Marker 1/8" from the other.

If you really want to put some work into it — and get super realism out of it - try this... Using an X-Acto Razor Saw, cut 2 pieces of straight track in half to form 4 pieces of singlelane track. Smooth cut edges with sandpaper. Assemble 2 of these single-lane pieces to each arm of a piece of "Y" track, using AFX Track Repair Clips to hold pieces together. Attach bottom of "Y" to end of straightaway. At the end of the single lanes, erect a dual station pit stop, gluing a strip of foam rubber to the inside walls. Voila! An accurate Drag Strip which can be set up and broken down in minutes.

If you have room for a permanent layout, this setup can be mounted on a board and completely detailed; or added to your road course layout. This would be an ideal project for any HO club. (continued on p. 2)


DRAGSTRIP

GOI - with any one of the four fabulous AFX Dragsters, featuring specially modified AFX chassis with dragster front end extension and super-wide super-size rear sponges. Each comes with its own wild 'n wonderful racing decals. These cars are designed specifically for drag racing and, like the real rails, they are not capable of negotiating a road course - run them only on straight track.


A complete line of AFX Dragster Service Parts can be obtained from your Aurora Model Motoring Dealer - No. 8666 blue Dragster Armature - \$2.00; No. 8660 Dragster Chassis and Brush Spring Assembly - \$1.10; No. 8662 Dragster Chassis Extension - 754; No. 8661 Gearplate with Cluster Gear -75¢; No. 8668 pinion gear 19 tooth), No. 8669 Idler gear (26 tooth), No. 8670 Idler gear (20 tooth) and No. 8671 Crown gear (15 tooth) - all 154 each; No. 8663 Dragster front end wire form and No. 8678 narrow dragster rear axle - both 10¢ each.

And you'll want a good supply of those special AFX Dragster wheels and rubber - No. 8674 Dragster front wheels and axle - 15¢ a set; No. 8675 slotted mag front wheels - 15¢; No. 8679 wide Dragster front tires - 25¢; No. 8676 slotted mag rear wheels - 254; No. 8680 medium rear tires - 504; and No. 8681 large rear tires - 50¢.

TRACK CLEANUP

I am the owner of an Aurora Commercial Table and we have experimented with everything to clean the track surface. But our club has found that the best thing is lighter fluid, Flex-i-Grit and Tire Traction. First, clean the surface using the lighter fluid sparingly. Then clean the rails with Flex-i-Grit, which leaves no grime on the track. Then, to get more speed, apply Tire Traction to the joints in the turns sparingly. Fallowing this method, we have knocked one second off our lap times. — Bob Graves, 2701 Pleasant Grove, Lansing, Mi. 48910

TRACK PROBLEMS

I think the new Aurora track is fine except for one thing. Why did they eliminate the screw hole in the middle? I have a large 4-lane layout and love the way the old track fastens to my board. It's easy to screw down and easy to take apart for changes. I think nailing it would be a lot harder with a greater chance of damaging the track or board. Even more important, it would be more difficult to change your layout. The guys at our club agree (H.O. Pro Racing Associaction of Flint). — Mark Beckner, 5263 Worchester Dr., Sw. Creek, Mich. 48473

I've checked out every piece of AFX track I've got, Mark, and the only pieces without mounting holes are the banked curves. However, the holes are quite small (to avoid marring the appearance for those who prefer not to mount the track), so perhaps you've overlooked them. They're located exactly ½ inch from each end of the track section, centered between the two lanes. Since the track material is very easy to work with, you'd have no problem enlarging the holes to accompdate screws. How about some race reports and Superdetailers Showcase entries from HOPRA? — Phil

BROKEN LOK-TABS

Why did you start the Speed Lok Track? I like the deep slot in the track because it keeps the cars on the track a lot better, but I'm sorry to say it breaks very easily. Can the Super II car get good performance on the Pit Row Special Race Set? I would like to get one. I think the AFX car is the best car made. — Howard Martin, 446 W. Richard Dr., Xenia, O. 45385

The AFX High Performance Track was designed because today's cars are too fast to stay on the older shallow-slotted tracks. As long as the new track is handled according to the instructions, it will not break so easily. Try using the new AFX Quikee-Lok, featured elsewhere in this issue, to assemble and take apart your layout. And, just in case someone should accidentally step on your track, Big A has solved the broken track joint problem with a great little gadget called the Track Repair Clip, now included in all Model Motoring Sets and available from your Aurora dealer. Just snap it onto the underside at the broken track joint and it's good as new. 

WHAT'S A MATADOR?

Even your garrulous garageman may not know for sure... But this little honey from AMC made the scene at Riverside in '73. It won the Winston-Western 500. It's being used by a number of satisfied law enforcement agencies across the nation, including the Los Angeles Police Department, the East Brunswick, N.J. Police and the Rutgers University Campus Police. AND, just for the Miniature Racer, it's in the Big A line-up for '73. the AFX Matador Stocker comes ready to race in red, white and blue with tinted windows, diaplane up front, rear spoiler, backlight braces, and Dietz fasteners on hood and trunk. It would take a lot of patience to remove all the racing options; but no major body work would be necessary to convert the stocker to a street model and detail it, perhaps, as a police car.



All race markings, including rear window braces and fuel cap, were removed; car was repainted Candy Apple Red Metalflake with high performance black hood, front spoiler and rear panel; raked rear end; side pipes, rear license plate, door handles and keyholes, front and back side lights were added; grill, headlights and turn signals detailed. White pinstripe design on hood is beautifully executed.
